John Chambers has worked for 20 years as a craftsman of functional stoneware, reproducing his own original designs for use in the home. Recent work for exhibit, however, has been devoted entirely to salt-glazed one-of-a-kind pieces. Chambers explores the range of colors and textures possible in this supposedly restricted medium, by exposing the pots to a greater or lesser degree to the direct attack of the flames. He uses both rock-salt and baking soda as the source of the sodium vapor, which creates a pock-marked glaze in place. Colored ash glazes are applied to some parts of the pots and allowed to run freely over the surface. Although Chambers fires with gas, some effects resemble those obtained from traditional wood-fueled kilns, as in the Bizen and Iga wares of ancient Japan. Some pieces further reflect Chambers' interest in the Japanese Tea Ceremony. The latest salt-glazed pieces are larger sculptural expressions, assembled in sections: the "Helmet Pot" series, 1988-1990.
