Claude Conover received his art education in painting and sculpture but for many years worked as a commercial designer before turning to ceramics. His "pottery forms" are created like sculpture . . . each one is individually hand formed in clay by the artist and not produced on a potter's wheel. These forms are mostly variations of traditional shapes, unglazed with textured surfaces, earthtone in color and reflect his sculptural background.
